Aman Venice, the 16th-century palace where the Clooneys celebrated their nuptials, will be back in business alongside the Grand Canal. Aman will begin reopening its hotels from June 1, starting with Amanruya, Turkey; **Amanemu**, Japan and **Amangani** in the US.



Design-forward **J.K. Place** is opening its Capri outpost first, a triumph of peerless refinement and Italian high design. It will have contactless check-in, a restaurant app and everyone inside the hotel will be required to wear a mask.

Over on Lake Como, two big names reopen: the celebrated **Villa d'Este**, with its floating pool (at reduced capacity), and the recently new **Mandarin Oriental Lake Como**.

Paragon 700 Boutique Hotel & Spa, in the heart of Puglia's White City Ostuni, finally opens its doors to guests – the original date of which was delayed because of the pandemic. The team have implemented a full range of cleanliness and safety measures including daily temperature checks for staff and guests on arrival.
